My Consultant practice till date has encompassed General surgery, Coloproctology and colorectal, peritoneal and pelvic surgical oncology.

My consultant practice in the UK @ Princess Alexandra Hospital - involved General Surgical and Colorectal surgical practice. It involved General surgery / emergency surgery with oncall rota of 1 in 7 / colorectal surgery both benign and malignant and endoscopy services. My academic appointment was as a senior lecturer @ Queen Mary University Hospital, London. Training and teaching involved me as a Surgical Tutor @ the RCS, London.

As a senior consultant colorectal surgeon @ Apollo hospitals - Have established the centre for colorectal surgery. I am also an associate professor of Surgery @ AHERF.

As a part of my higher surgical training, I undertook generic , specialist and sub-specialty training in Colorectal, pelvic and peritoneal oncology. St. Marks, The Royal Marsden and The Christie were centres of specialist tertiary colo-rectal practice. Following completion of general surgical and trauma training, I have embarked on advanced colo-rectal training involving minimally invasive, exenterational and cyto-reductive surgery. I have spent time at St. Marks hospital gaining skill and exposure in MAS (Laparoscopy, SILS & TAMIS), advanced proctology, Pelvic floor, Intestinal failure, IBD, Polyposis, re-do surgery, recurrent rectal cancers and exenterational surgery. A short fellowship in MAS (Laparoscopy, Robotics) & Exenterational surgery at the Royal Marsden was undertaken. This was followed by a further fellowship in Colorectal, Peritoneal, and Pelvic Oncology with emphasis on Cyto-reductive surgery & HIPEC at The Christie in Manchester, where there was exposure to MIS (Laparoscopy & Robotics). I

was appointed as a laparoscopic colorectal surgeon at Princess Alexandra hospital in Essex in Spring 2017. Further knowledge, skill and experience augmentation has been done from oncology fellowships undertaken at the Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New-York and Champalimaud Foundation in Lisbon, Portugal.

I am a minimally invasive surgeon with use of Laparoscopy / SILS and Robotics as tools. In addition to the generic benign and malignant colorectal work, I hold experience and expertise in pelvic onco-surgery and peritoneal surface malignancies (Cyto-reductive surgery + HIPEC).

My training in district hospitals, Trauma centres and Tertiary referral centres have exposed me to a broad generality of Trauma, general and colorectal surgery (open and laparoscopic). **I am a JAG accredited upper and lower GI endoscopist and Trainer.** Placements post CCT fellowships exposed me to a broad spectrum of tertiary referral practice in colorectal / anal cancers, laparoscopy, pelvic exenterational surgery, Cytoreductive surgery, Robotics and advanced pelvic surgery. In addition knowledge and skills relevant to advanced proctology, IBD, Polyposis, Intestinal failure, pelvic floor and complex colorectal cases were gained. I undertake Ano-rectal physiology and am trained at EAUS skills.

Health outcomes research and patient orientated qualitative research are of great interest to me. Management of low rectal cancers, recurrent cancers and peritoneal carcinomatosis are challenging. I would like to weave together my research expertise, clinical acumen and judgement in the decision making process, integrating patient choices into the decision making process of this complex clinical entity. I started my consultant practice on a broad base with both general and colorectal work from April 2017. Emergency, endoscopy, proctology, general surgery benign and laparoscopic colorectal resections are what, I have been doing in the last 8 years of my practice. My expertise now spans low rectal cancer, recurrent cancers, exenterational surgery and peritoneal malignancies @ a tertiary referral practice. In addition to building a sub-speciality colo-rectal unit, I was instrumental in building the Robotic services as the co-ordinator for Robotic surgery programme.

Apollo Institute of colo-rectal surgery (Bangalore) : I have been instrumental in building the new organ specific, subspecialty oriented colo-rectal services under one roof. The department has been built with further new appointments, development of website, brochures, creation of bowel wellness packages (Health check), dedicated bowel wellness clinic, pelvic happiness clinic, Life after Cancer clinic (LACC) etc. A dedicated pelvic floor unit is in place, In addition, we have a dedicated colorectal cancer screening service.

Research : I am the **Principal Investigator for the Pytest (Breath test) vs RUT (Biopsy)** : A comparative commercial pilot study by Tri-med Australia and Arcolab, Bangalore. Completed. The remuneration to the Institution was about 50 lakhs.

Tumour board services : Tumour board (MDT) is the heart of cancer care. I was instrumental in bring the tumour board to a form and improve the documentation. We also made it mandatory to scan the tumour board outcomes to the patients e-notes.

Summary: My role involves both as a general surgeon and a specialist colo-rectal surgeon. My sub-speciality interest is in Cancer surgery (colonic + rectal). I take part in the general surgical on call managing the emergencies. Elective work includes proctology, IBD, Benign colo-rectal and Onco-surgery related to the Lower gastro-intestinal tract.

I am active on the teaching and the research front, in addition to organising and running the international study days both at Home and abroad. On the research front, I am working on Quality improvement programmes, Decision making and Human factors in Surgery. Specific work in progress includes the Clinician burnout and second victim process.

Quality Improvement in Surgery (QIPS): On the Quality improvement front, I am actively involved in Quality improvement programmes in Surgery (QIPS). These include

- **“Surgeon well-being & Safe patient initiative ”** - Exploring the second victim phenomenon....The Surgeon as the "second victim" - An area less explored, less attended, less supported and very intriguing.... is being explored with focus groups for service improvement.
- **MyMUL (My Mistakes You Learn)** – Is a transparent learning process from the mistakes done. It is encouraging a culture of transparency and openness.
- **LORG (Laparotomy outcomes review group): Core member** – Surgical mortalities for the years 2016 were reviewed and lessons learnt on decision making.
- **MoRG (Mortality review group): Core member** – The diverticular deaths were reviewed following a Dr Foster alert. Following review lessons learnt included the need for better palliative care process and decision making when investigating patients who are frail and elderly.
- **MDT** : Standardisation of radiology reporting in MDTs & improvement in data entry on cancer
- **Clinical coding review** : A comparative clinical coding review was undertaken as a part of QA for clinical coding. This raised issues related to appropriateness of coding and financial nuances where payments were made to medical directorates instead of surgical. This was rectified.

Surgical outcomes review and research centre (SORRC): I initiated the process of setting up the Surgical outcomes review and research centre (SORRC) & The Essex Rivers Research partnership (TERRP).

Work in progress :

Peer review and communication sessions (PeRCs): These are sessions between the primary and the secondary care. Involve the best practice discussions, referrals and pathways discussion. Here in India - i have championed the C2C partnerships with the primary and tertiary care clinicians.

Decision making in Surgery (DeMIS): I am working on the surgical decision making model in the elderly and the frail through multimodal participation of the Surgeons, Anaesthesiologists, Intensivists and the care of the elderly.

Prehabilitation in Colon, Rectal and Anal surgery (PICRAS): A PICRAS pack consisting of a Spirometer, pedometer, chewing gum, antiseptic soap and ABX pre-operatively is being considered for patients.

Pre-operative preparatory Information Talk (POPIT): This is information delivery platform for patients planned every fortnight for 40 minutes. The POPIT team consists of surgeon, anaesthetist, physiotherapist, stoma therapist and an ERAS nurse. Small presentations will be done and questions taken from patients prior to their surgical procedures. With time, this might be given to the patients as a disc or even view online.

Research & Training :

Are we Coping: Exploring the second victim phenomenon in surgery? This is an exploratory study

looking at clinicians going through burnout and psychological stress secondary to complications.

In addition, I worked on improvement of the surgical section of the website

Teaching : I was the Royal College Tutor for Surgery, comes with it the responsibility of surgical training in the Trust. I teach on the FRCS Higher surgical course at the Whipps cross hospital. Faculty @ invivox a peer to peer learning and teaching platform. www.invivox.com/

Administrative: I was involved in shortlisting and interviews for appointment of Locum professionals and Junior doctors. This helps in running the unit smoothly.

Post – CCT Fellowships (Clinical)

International Fellowship in Robotic Colorectal Surgery, EARCS training programme, Champalimaud Foundation, Portugal (22nd Feb - 22nd May 2018) : Prof. Amjad Parvaiz

I was privileged to be one of the initial trainees on the fellowship programme, run by the EARCS. The Programme involved anatomical modules on colonic and rectal anatomy. Technical modules included the learning of the Da Vinci system. Case Observations were undertaken both at the Champalimaud clinic in Lisbon and other centers in England. Lectures, which covered thorough knowledge of pelvic anatomy and the theory behind Total Mesorectal Excision (TME) surgery, were attended. Lecture-based teachings as well as live case observations were undertaken.

System and Dissection Training Course (two consecutive days) was done previously in Switzerland. Console/System Training Course was done to gain insight and competence with the system and console. This was followed by the porcine training model and cadaveric training. Procedure Specific Cadaveric Course was done in Geneva, Switzerland.

A good volume of robotic colonic and complex rectal cancer operations were observed and assisted. The detailed log will be provided on request. Assessments with GAS forms and submission of videos are pending prior to sign off.

I was a part of the faculty for the Laparoscopic training programme in Portugal and was involved in setting up the laparoscopic colo-rectal training programme for the government of Serbia.

I was a part of two specialty conferences Angels and Demons in Rectal Cancer: Champalimaud Foundation, Lisbon, held on 22 – 23rd Feb 2018 & RSM summer overseas meeting / Champalimaud Centre, held on 17 - 18th May 2018.

Following a programme of fellowship, courses, conferences, workshops, inreach programmes, outreach programmes, mentored and unmentored operating and blinded assessments – Fellowship and competencies for Robotic colo-rectal surgery have been granted by the EARCS.

A consensus statement following the rectal cancer meeting is written up and is pending submission.

The Christie Colorectal, Peritoneal and Pelvic Oncology fellowship, Manchester, UK : (Oct 16 – Mar 17) : Surgical Oncology centre, The Christie NHS Foundation Trust, Manchester, UK

Summary: The Christie is one of the largest cancer treatment centres in Europe. It is an international leader in cancer research and development and home to the Paterson Institute for Cancer Research. The fellowship at the Christie hospital involves advanced colorectal surgery (locally advanced and recurrent colorectal cancers). The main work is around Cytoreductive surgery for pseudo-myxoma Peritonei and peritoneal carcinomatosis of colo-rectal origin. Christie is also the referral centre of anal cancers and Sarcomas. The key learning happens from the complex and rare cancer Multi-disciplinary team (MDT) / Tumour board meetings. This includes Complex pelvic cancers, Peritoneal tumours, Anal cancers, Neuro-endocrine Tumours (NET), Sarcoma and Complex pathology MDTs. There is an added benefit with Minimally invasive surgery (Laparoscopy and Robotics). As a part of the on-call, we were exposed to Colorectal, Urological, Gynaecological, Head / neck and plastic surgical patients.

Quality improvement programme in Surgery (QIPS): A Q4 Mortality and Morbidity meeting was presented by me. I was involved in data entry, analysis, summary, comparison with the previous quarters and previous 4 years. This was looked in comparison to the American NSQIP database and literature reviewed. Learning points were generated, minutes of the presentation were sent and the data added to the database.

Research: Life after CRS & HIPEC – A qualitative study. This is an exploratory psycho-oncological study. I am the primary researcher for this PROMS project. Involves a qualitative methodology with patient focus groups. It is in the process of being badged as an NIHR project under the leadership of Prof. Renehan.

Summary: St. Mark’s Hospital is the only hospital in the world to specialise entirely in intestinal and colorectal medicine and is a national and international referral centre for intestinal and colorectal disorders. Wolfson centre for endoscopy is one of only 14 worldwide, to be recognised as a centre of excellence by the World Organisation of Digestive Endoscopy. Born in 1835, Some of the good and the great of colorectal surgery associated with St. Marks are Frederick Salmon, Francis Avery-Jones, Lockhart-Mummery, Cuthbert Dukes, David Henry Goodsall and Sir Alan Parks. In addition to fistula surgery, Goodsall’s rule, ‘Dukes’ staging system, Polyposis, APC gene, Ileo-anal pouch was invented here. The living legends include Prof. John Nicholls, John Northover, Robin Phillips & Susan Clark The fellowship period at St. Marks was a milestone both on professional and personal progression. I spent eighteen months very productively. I rotated through all the placements involving complex proctology, Intestinal failure, pelvic floor, polyposis, IBD, cancers (complex locally advanced and recurrent cancers) and exenterational work. The work included both minimally (Laparoscopy / SILS) and maximally invasive (Pelvic exenterations / sacrectomies) approaches. I also gained exposure and experience in newer techniques of VAAFT, SILS and TAMIS.

I undertook outpatient clinics, dealing with 2ww new referrals, follow ups as well as complex tertiary

referrals. The summary of my experience includes a total of 2140 outpatient reviews & 1003 operative procedures including 157 endoscopies and 67 Ano-rectal physiology measurements. The specialist skills gained include endo-anal USS, ARP and pelvic floor skills including awareness about bio-feedback programmes. Pelvic floor clinics were challenging in that we have to deal with both organic and functional aspects of the patients. The MDT meetings (Polyp, IBD, Pelvic floor, Cancer, Complex cancer, IF and radiology) were a huge learning opportunity, especially given that the fellows are responsible for smooth running of MDTs involving presentation of the cases to documentation. Joint clinics with the physicians help in dealing with functional and medical complexities. Every aspect of the Patient journey in the peri-operative process is taken care of. This involve checking on the pre-operative clerking, bloods, HDU / ITU bed, consenting, operating, post-operative care and discharge with follow up planning. The case mix is rich with Complex proctology, pelvic floor, inflammatory bowel disease, Intestinal failure, Cancer and complex cancer patients. The joy of the job is you get to see the most complex cases and get involved. There is opportunity to develop skills involving laparoscopic, open and advanced exenterative surgery.

I was actively involved in Health outcomes research, in addition to secondary research undertaking systematic reviews. Thrombo-prophylaxis audit was undertaken, thereby bringing change to clinical practice. Evaluating clinical performance was done in the Clinical governance set up and I have been a part of process with Mortality and Morbidity audit and presentations. Two grand round presentations were made on Decision making in cancer surgery and Thrombo-prophylaxis. I secured a grant of 2000 GBP for the research study from St. Mark's foundation. Presentations and publication on precision onco-surgery was achieved. The work was nominated for the SARS prize presentation and published in the Annals of the college. A book on Decision making in surgery and cancer care was published during the same period. I have been an invited speaker for a number of international meetings in Bangalore and Mumbai. I visited CMC Vellore, as a part of ASGBI / BJS Overseas Surgical Fellowship. Attended a number of educational courses and also was active in teaching for the FRCS (Christie & St. Marks) and post graduate teaching term for the visiting clinicians to St. Marks. I have been Training; Teaching and supporting juniors on the floor, in addition to taking part in post graduate teaching programme under the St Marks Academic Institute. I have been invited as a part of the faculty for the instructional course in colo-proctology for the ACRSI (India). **I have progressed with my endoscopy skills and undertook a number of endoscopy courses including TTT colonoscopy trainers to become a colonoscopy trainer.** I was an invited speaker at the joint meeting of the ISUCRS, ACRSI & ISPF held in Mumbai. I also attended a number of educational meetings including the St. Marks colo-rectal Frontiers as a part of CME. I have been nominated as an examiner for the EBSQ (Europe) examinations in colo-proctology.

On the administrative front, my responsibilities included attending to the work generated from the services, checking on the investigations, arranging follow ups and checking on the discharge summaries. Operative work generated from the clinics are booked on the waiting list, planned & executed in conjunction with the senior colleagues. Anaesthetic input is sought on complex patients very early on in the process. Active participation is undertaken in maintaining the operative diaries. Dealing with complaints has taught me the importance of understanding the patient expectations, risk communication and being transparent. I was a part of the interview panel for appointments of the members of the junior team.

I was active on the social front with organisation of social events as a part of team building exercise. I also took part in the St.Marks day participating in the annual show. I was instrumental in facilitating the initial foundational steps towards St. Mark's to go international to Bangalore, India. On a personal front, I believe I am a better person, speak less, listen more, work productively and am more effective and efficient.

Quality improvement programme in Surgery (QIPS): Audit on the use of post-operative thrombo-prophylaxis in addition to review of literature and presentation of the same. I was active in the monthly

Mortality and Morbidity meetings and was involved in preparation of the same.

Research: Life after pelvic exenteration – A qualitative study: This is an exploratory psycho-oncological study. I am helping out a co-researcher for this PROMS project. Involves a qualitative methodology with patient focus groups. I was also involved in the database entry for the TATME procedures.

The Royal Marsden Fellowship: Minimally invasive (Laparoscopy / Robotic) & Exenterative surgery. Feb 16 – Apr 16. Surgical oncology centre, The Royal Marsden NHS Foundation Trust. Prof. Tekkis & Mr S Rasheed.

Summary: The Royal Marsden was the first hospital in the world dedicated to the study and treatment of cancer. It was founded as the Free Cancer Hospital in 1851. I was exposed to Minimally invasive colorectal surgery including Laparoscopy and Robotics. I had the opportunity to train on the robotic simulator and clock training hours. In addition, I gained exposure / experience in exenterational surgery.

Clinical Experience

In addition to managing the surgical patients both on wards as well as critical care setting, I am well versed with the general surgical operative procedures confronted in an emergency setting. I have worked in tertiary, regional centres for Trauma, The Royal London hospital & Brighton and Sussex University Hospital. This has provided me with a rich trauma experience in the management of acute poly trauma patients involving blunt and penetrating injuries. The Higher surgical training to date has given me the experience elective index cases in General surgery inclusive of Colorectal / UGI / HPB / Transplant (Liver and renal) / Breast & Endocrine and Vascular surgery. Following my general stem, I have spent time specialising in Colorectal surgery, rotating through Sussex, Kent and London. In London, have spent time at the Royal London Hospital and will be spending time at St. Mark's hospital. I believe, the training has provided me with both open and laparoscopic skills, expected of me for my level of training. **I am JAG accredited for UGI diagnostic endoscopies and diagnostic & therapeutic colonoscopist.**

Advanced Laparoscopic and colonoscopy skills are something I am working on. Proctology / intestinal failure / pelvic floor dysfunction & polyposis are some of my other interests. Low rectal cancers, recurrent rectal cancers, Peritoneal malignancies are challenging and I believe will offer changing management options in terms of newer techniques, decision making, judgement and ultimately QOL of patients and patient preferences. A consolidated ISCP operative log is available on request. I have to my credit more than 6000 procedures since 2008.

Trauma and critical care competencies (The Royal London Hospital - Major Trauma Centre): I was privileged to be a part of the Trauma on-call during my final year training. Managing the trauma patients during the golden hour was part of the norm. There were air ambulance services at the RLH. I went through training in Damage Control Surgery, ATLS and CCriSP. An ITU placement at Royal Victoria infirmary in Newcastle upon Tyne, UK as a part of my basic surgical training has embedded the basics of physiology and critical care into my practice.

M.D. Thesis: “Decision making in SURGERY and CANCER CARE” MD (Medicine-Academic Surgery) Awarded 2012 – University of Hull, UK. Srinivasaiah, Narasimhaiah. 2011-07. Decision making in surgery and cancer care. Oai-hull-ac-uk-hull-4798.

My research post, as Fellow in the Academic Surgical Unit at Hull and East Yorkshire Hospitals, was undertaken under the supervision of Prof. John Monson. The work involved an investigation into the way decisions are made in Surgery and Cancer care. A particular emphasis was placed on the socio-cultural

and geographical factors impacting on the decision making. The work was purely clinical involving the clinicians and the patients. These were all performed personally and this allowed me the opportunity to gain some valuable experience in these qualitative research techniques. This work was completed, compiled and accepted as a Thesis presentation, culminating in a research MD. Much of this work has been published and presented. Amongst the studies performed were:

1a. Focus group discussions on patient decision making in cancer care. I showed that there exists a significant variation in the decision making process based on a socio-cultural, educational and geographical factors. This was the first time that such important findings has been described amongst the clinicians in decision making and has important clinical and therapeutic implications. I demonstrated that hard data is important but, the decision making takes into consideration a number of other factors.

Other studies (not included in Thesis)

1b. HOM & HRQOL measures in cancer care were detailed as reviews.

1c. HOM in breast surgery (Onco-surgery & Aesthetic) was reviewed.

2. A Randomized, Subject and Evaluator Blinded, Sham Controlled, Multicentre Study to Evaluate Efficacy and Safety of Non-Animal Stabilized Hyaluronic Acid with Dextranomer (NASHA/Dx) for the Treatment of Fecal Incontinence (2007 – 2010). I undertook the study as a participating centre and was involved in recruitment, treatment and follow up.

3. Thrombo-prophylaxis in colorectal surgery – A National Questionnaire Survey (2008). The National Questionnaire Survey on thrombo-prophylaxis demonstrated a high degree of concordance with the available guidelines, except for thrombo-prophylaxis to be continued postoperatively for a period of 28 days/4 weeks.

4. Long term outcomes of QOL, Pulmonary, Biomechanical and Cost Effectiveness of Reduction Mammoplasty – a prospective randomised controlled trial (2008). – This demonstrated a persistent effect of reduction mammoplasty on the QOL, and this is the only such study till date.

5. National Questionnaire survey on impact of CRO7 trial on current practice in the UK (2006). Through this study, I showed that despite the evidence of the CRO7 trial supporting the use of NASCRT for operable rectal cancer, approximately two-third of consultant surgeons in the UK have yet to implement this treatment regime routinely. A change in practice in 39% of surgeons following the early dissemination of trial results indicate that colorectal surgeons practice is guided by scientific evidence.

6. Radiotherapy in rectal cancer: is it time for change? A qualitative analysis of the national questionnaire survey of members of ACPGBI on preliminary CRO7 results was undertaken by me. This suggested change in practice is a slow and complex process influenced not only by data and scientific evidence, but also by a combination of other factors. Some of them are Clinical decision making, EBP/Education, Research Translation and Organizational factors with Infrastructure/Resources. Some of the above-mentioned conclusions will aid the policy makers and the opinion leaders in the National Health Service (NHS).

Further research: Since completing my Thesis, my research in these areas has continued. Some of them are detailed

7. Sacral nerve stimulation for pelvic disorders (constipation, chronic pelvic pain, vulvodynia, pouch incontinence) – A review (2007). Initial findings suggest that SNS is beneficial in this difficult to treat clinical condition.
8. Long term outcomes of use of hyperbaric oxygen in chronic anal fissures – A prospective study (2007), showed that HBO in the treatment of CAF is beneficial and treatment lasted in a long term, however the cost implications is something that needs to be evaluated in addition to undertaking this study on a larger scale.
9. Rectal Irrigation on Faecal Continence Disorders: Review of a prospective database (2006). This work showed that RI should be a treatment option in the management of disorders of defecation.
10. A point prevalence survey of wounds in north-east England: Point prevalence interface audit (2006). This work showed that Wounds represent a significant cause of morbidity in the general population. A systematic focus is necessary on effective and timely diagnosis, on ensuring treatment is appropriate to the cause and condition of the wound and on active measures to prevent complications. A number of initiatives have commenced in order to provide an effective and efficient wound care, following this work.
11. Home Parenteral nutrition (HPN): A Welsh experience – A prospective review, showed that the HPN programme has been successfully implemented in the Welsh healthcare. Additionally, I also showed that the presence of at least 100 cms of healthy small bowel and presence of large bowel are indicators for discontinuation of TPN following reversal of stoma..
12. Enhanced Recovery after Colorectal Surgery: A DGH perspective 2010 – 11: . This showed ERAS can be successfully implemented in a DGH; however, patient selection is important taking into consideration patient age and co-morbidities. Early involvement of elderly care physicians in elderly patients will improve the success rate of ERAS.
13. Outcome of STEPS colorectal foundation programme (ICENI, Colchester & EES) 2011-12: An electronic questionnaire based survey. A multimodal training approach involving clinical knowledge, technical skills and decision making can be delivered in a structured programme of this nature to augment laparoscopic training needs of Colorectal trainees. The STEPS foundation programme seems to be effective for laparoscopic Colorectal surgical training, with current content and structure.
